Shirley Locklear

Shirley Mae Revels Locklear is a retired administrator with extensive experience and success in providing services to low-income Indian families in Robeson and adjoining counties.

From 1974 to 2003, she served as a key leader in major programs of Lumbee Regional Development Association that served disadvantaged people. During her career, Ms. Locklear served as the Director of the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, REACH, Community Food and Nutrition Program, SSI Outreach, and other programs that helped Indian families to obtain services including home energy assistance, food stamps, Medicaid, and AFDC.

Of her work Ms. Locklear stated, "I always felt my job was to fight for my people and open doors to see that needy families received help." Her contributions and leadership resulted in new and improved services to Indian people, which are still ongoing today. Ms. Locklear managed the first major block grant of funds from the federal government to the Lumbee Tribe in partnership with the State of North Carolina. Shirley directed the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program from 1986-2003 which served about 5000 households in Robeson, Hoke, and Scotland counties each year. This program was a model that other tribes and state agencies followed. The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program is now operated by the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina.

Ms. Locklear was a leader in organizing services for Indian elders, in providing free and low cost food for needy families, and improving education and health services in the region. In recent years, she has served extensively as a volunteer leader serving local elders with the Senior Traveling Companions, based in Pembroke. Ms. Locklear organized partnerships with a host of agencies at the local, state, and national levels, such as the North Carolina Department of Social Services, the US Department of Energy, the Community Services Agency of the US, and the US Social Security Administration.

From 1974 to the present, Ms. Locklear served as an employee and volunteer with LRDA, serving for over 42 years. During this period she worked with model programs that helped to reduce

hunger in Robeson County, and improved access to services of Robeson County Department of Social Services. Shirley served as Project Director for the Community Food and Nutrition Program, which provided innovative services to help low-income families grow and process their own garden foods. This LRDA Program operated a food co-op and food pantry with significant support from Campbell Soup Company, Food Lion, Lumbee River EMC, and Scottish Packing.

In addition to directing the LIHEAP program of LRDA, in 1991-1993, Ms. Locklear directed a LRDA program funded through the US Social Security Administration that worked to help American Indian individuals who were eligible for SSI services, but were not receiving them.

During her extensive career, Ms. Locklear served on Board of Directors and a leader in many organizations serving Robeson County. The following organizations are some in which she served: NC Hunger Coalition, Food Lion Advocacy Board, Outdoor Drama "Strike-At-The Wind", Robeson County Board of Education, Human Relation Commission for the City of Lumberton, and the Lumberton Housing Authority. In 1994, she received a major honor from the State of North Carolina when she was named a "Path Maker." She was one of twenty-two Native women in the State to receive this honor.

From 1980 to the present, Ms. Locklear served as a leader in providing services to Indian senior citizens and to improve their quality of life. Beginning in 1983, Shirley worked with Bill Deese owner of a tour bus company to take groups of local senior citizens on out-of-area trips to places like St. Augustine, Florida and other areas of interest. To date, this effort is continuing and the senior citizens have traveled to locations in to forty-seven states and two countries.

In 2003, she helped to organize the Senior Traveling Companions, a private, non-profit organization that provides extensive services to elders in the region. The Senior Traveling Companions (STC) has over 65 members who work to provide services to elders and handicapped individuals in need. STC also organizes and supports trips for the members to various tourist attractions in the region and out of state. STC is supported by dues, donations, and annual fundraising efforts.

Shirley Mae Revels Locklear grew up on a farm in the Saddletree Community. She attended Magnolia High School and Robeson Community College. She was married to the late Jimmie Locklear of Rennert. She is the mother of two children, Felicia A. Hunt and James K. Locklear. She is also the proud grandmother of four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Of her career, Ms. Locklear commented "I am so happy to have been a part of this wonderful organization called LRDA and the Senior Traveling Companions, a group of senior citizens whom I dearly love. I cannot express what it has been like to see LRDA and STC grow from the beginning, to meet so many good people, and delight in travel with others. I pray that I have done something worthwhile to help my Indian people along the way. Have I lived my dreams of working with my people or made life better for some of them? I like to think so. I know there is still a great deal to be done. I am so thankful to the leaders of LRDA and others who gave me the chance to work and to serve."

Illya, was well-known to many as the "Funnel Cake Queen." Illya's Concession was at most outdoor events, sometimes at two or more locations on the same day. The majority of time, you could anticipate waiting in a line to get one of those mouthwatering funnel cakes, delicious turkey legs, zesty blooming onions and amazing ribbon fries. To many people, Illya's Concession was much more than a mobile food unit, it was her "Ministry." It was a place where people found love, hope, laughter, encouragement, praise, and motivation to fight no matter what circumstances tried to stop them.



Lumbee Pinecone Patchwork Regalia

Each year the newly crowned Ambassadors slips on a calico or cotton dress, dons a traditional apron, and envelops herself in a rich tradition that can only be described as Lumbee.

Over the years the Miss/Teen/Junior/Little Miss Lumbees' have worn
Lumbee Pinecone Patchwork dresses as an outward sign of their dedication
to cultural awareness, cultural integrity, and cultural renewal.

The Lumbee dress takes its name from the symbolic pinecone patchwork worn on the apron. The pinecone symbol is based on the longleaf pinecone. When turned on its end the pinecone matches the intricate design of the patchwork.



in my car to travel you have truly made this


