



**Rev. Robert "Bob" Mangum** is a retired minister who has served as an outstanding leader in church ministry, justice, and social service in Robeson County, in North Carolina, and on church missions around the nation and world. He served as a minister in Robeson County from 1958 to 1991 and served as pastor for six different area churches. He has held many leadership positions in church ministries of the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church (UMC) and in agencies that serve people in poverty in Robeson County.

In 1991, after thirty-three years of ministry in Robeson County, he became executive director of the Southeastern Jurisdictional Agency for Native American Ministries (SEJANAM) at Lake Junaluska, NC. In 2000, he returned to Robeson County to become the first coordinator of the Rockingham District Native American Cooperative Ministry of the UMC and to pastor churches. Since 2002, he has served as a volunteer pastor for Hickory Grove United Methodist Church in Clio, South Carolina.

From 1969 to 1978, Rev. Mangum was a leader in the creation and operation of Robeson County Church and Community Center. He has served as a leader for many community agencies and organizations. The following are a few of those: Lumbee Regional Development Association, Robeson County Board of Education, Prisoners Friends Society, Native American Interfaith Ministries (The Healing Lodge), and Robeson County Community Development Corporation.

Rev. Mangum has served as a leader at the state and national levels on activities related to Native American ministries, volunteer missions, and disaster relief efforts. He volunteered with work teams to provide assistance to families suffering from hurricane storm damage in Florida and Louisiana. For many years, he served as a leader for work teams from local churches to serve in countries in Nicaragua and Bolivia.

Rev. Mangum has lived a life of passion for holistic ministry with a commitment to pastoral evangelism, missions, justice, and social service ministries. Of his work he said, "Love is drawn by opportunity, not driven by obligation." Rev Mangum received numerous honors and awards for his work in the church and the community, his service, and accomplishments. The following are examples of some of the honors and awards given to Rev. Mangum. UNC-Pembroke gave him the honorary degree Doctor of Humane Letters. SEJANAM established the Bolivia Educational Ministry Endowment in his honor. LRDA gave him a Distinguished Service Award and the first Hamilton McMillan Award.

For over 60 years, Rev. Mangum has provided outstanding leadership and service in professional, civic and public service organizations in communities where he lived. He has served as a catalyst for great change in Robeson County where he worked to involve people across racial, class, and denominational separateness to work in cooperative endeavors to identify and address social problems. People that know of his work agree that he is a leader in addressing problems of poverty, injustice, voter rights, and empowerment of the poor and downtrodden.

Born in Washington, DC, and reared in Brandywine, Maryland, Rev. Mangum has traveled extensively in his career and service. He graduated from Asbury College in Wilmore, Kentucky in 1955. He graduated from Asbury Theological Seminary in 1958 and completed further studies at Duke Divinity School, in Durham, NC.

Rev. Mangum and his family came to Robeson County in 1958 where he served as pastor of First Methodist Church of Pembroke and pastor of the Methodist Student Movement on the campus of Pembroke State University. Rev. Mangum and his wife Neila Roberts Mangum live in Pembroke. Mrs. Mangum taught for four years at Pembroke High School and worked for 18 years at UNC-Pembroke. Their three children: Phyllis, Susan, and Steve all attended school in Pembroke and graduated from Pembroke High School. The family has grown and includes 13 grandchildren.


We support parents in fulfilling their parental roles and help them move toward independence. Our program responds to the unique strengths and needs of the community and of each child and family within the community.

The Old Foundry Restaurant Gave Indian People The Opportunity

To Be Themselves, And Find Freedom In Doing So.


#### "Indians through The Front Door"

The Old Foundry Restaurant was established in 1946 in Lumberton off highway 301 (since changed to I-95) being the only Indian owned and managed menu served Restaurant in Robeson County. This was ground breaking for Indian communities due to the racial segregation they were subjected to during these turbulent times. Racial segregation kept the American Indians and African Americans separate from the white Americans in daily activities, such as eating in a restaurant, drinking from a water fountain, using a public restroom, attending school, and going to the movies. The Old Foundry restored a sense of freedom and pride for Indians, giving them a place to enjoy a nice meal in a welcoming atmosphere where they mingled with new and old friends. The Old Foundry opened front doors for Indians versus sneaking through back doors to use bathrooms only to be told they couldn't because they were Indian.

Not only did the Old Foundry give Indian people a place to feel accepted and celebrated in who they were, the restaurant had a diverse menu with great food. The Old Foundry's menu specialized in seafood, steaks, chicken, homemade milk shakes and all beef hamburgers. They also were known for their fast and friendly curb service. The jukebox was a main stay for all who entered the doors of the Old Foundry. Bobbie Sampson, niece of the owners of the Old Foundry, recalls as a teenager fond memories of going to the Old Foundry "to listen to jukebox music and having a snack, especially after Friday night basketball games". This was a great hangout place for her and her friends. The Old Foundry played a big part in her life and still holds a special place in her heart today. There were governors and politicians who frequented the restaurant and it was even rumor ed that occasionally movie stars would stop in for a bite to eat after a long stretch on highway 301.
