RODERICK GLENN LOCKLEAR

Roderick G. Locklear whose background includes being a farmer, teacher, basketball coach, recruiter, counselor, job developer, community organizer, manpower specialist, project director, program manager, team leader, deputy director and director has worked and administered programs at the local, State and Federal levels over the past four decades, is a graduate of Pembroke State University and the Federal Mid-Career Training Program at Princeton University in New Jersey. He is the son of the Late Rev. Clarence E, (CE) Locklear and Mrs. Annie Lizzie Oxendine Locklear. Rod and his wife Ruth L. Locklear, daughter of Mr. Emery (deceased) and Ms. Addell Locklear of the Mount Airy Community maintains residence in both Columbia, Maryland and Pembroke, N.C. They have two sons, Roderick Glenn Locklear, Jr. and Clarence Eden Locklear II, and granddaughters: Jessica, Sidney and Drew Locklear. The Locklear family is enrolled members of the Lumbee Tribe.

In 1968, Mr. Locklear was one of the founders and charter Board Member of Lumbee Regional Development Association, Inc. (LRDA). He was a strong advocate for establishing the Lumbee

Tribal Enrollment Program administered by LRDA until a tribal government was established for the Lumbee people. He was one of the founders and charter Board Members of the National American Indian Council and played a key role in establishing the N.C. Native American Youth Organization while working at the N.C. Commission of Indian Affairs in the early 1980's. For several years, he served as a Board Member of the N.C. United Tribes organization that sponsors an Annual N.C. Indian Unity Conference. He was elected to the Town Council, Town of Pembroke in 1979. He was one of the Lumbee delegates at the National Congress of American Indians (NCAI) when the Lumbee joined the NCAI in the early 1980's. He served on the Department of Health and Human Services Intra-Department Council on Indian Affairs. He served on the Lumbee Self Determination Commission (1999-2001) that was responsible for developing the frame work for the Lumbee people to conduct elections to establish a governing body for the Lumbee Tribe. He was elected to the first Tribal Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina. He served on the LRDA and the Lumbee Tribe Federal Recognition Committees. He is a member of the LRDA Land Trust Committee, and continues to serve on various committees and workgroups impacting Indian people.

Locklear is a recipient of: Governor of North Carolina Award "The Order of the Long Leaf Pine," Lumbee Indian Tribes Distinguished Service Award in 1980, LRDA Distinguished Service Award 2005, and several Special Achievement Awards from organizations, state and federal agencies where he has worked.



BRUCE JONES

Bruce and his brothers and sisters were raised by their grandparents Dovie (Lowery) and Arthur Jones on a small farm in Robeson County. After attending schools in Pembroke, Florida and Buffalo New York, Bruce served in the 82nd Airborne and then returned to Pembroke to complete his college education at Pembroke State University.

Upon completing his degree at PSU, he became a school teacher and later served as a school principal in the Shoe Heel and Rex Rennert communities of Robeson County.

In 1965 he left Robeson County and managed a statewide experimental employment and training project funded by the US Department of Labor with the North Carolina Fund an anti-poverty program established by Governor Terry Sanford and based in Durham, NC. He was also the Director of Operations for MDC, a non-profit research and development anti-poverty agency based in Chapel Hill, NC. It was during this period that Bruce became involved in developing the

Lumbee Regional Development Association (LRDA) and was one of the founding creators of that organization. In 1976, Bruce became the Executive Director of the NC Commission of Indian Affairs where he worked on behalf of NC Indian tribes and organizations for over 17 years. While in this capacity, he was President of the Governor's Interstate Indian Commission, and the Southeastern Area Vice-President for the National Congress of American Indians.

Retiring in 1994, Bruce continues his work on behalf of the Lumbee tribe and other Indian interests and issues through his continuing service on many boards, committees and advocacy groups.




HORACE LOCKLEAR

Horace Locklear, a Lumbee Indian, was born and raised in the Saddletree Community of Robeson County, North Carolina. He received his early education in Robeson County Public Schools. He earned a B.S. Degree from Pembroke State College (now UNC-Pembroke).

He graduated from North Carolina Central University School of Law, earning a Jurist Doctorate degree in 1972. He was the first Native American licensed to practice law in the State of North Carolina.

Horace Locklear's 20 years of private law practice also included politics. He was elected to the North Carolina State House of Representatives where he served three 2-year terms.



GERALD SIDER

I came to Pembroke in the spring of 1967, for 18 months, to do civil rights work – voter registration, election organizing, pressure against social services and the banks for fair treatment of Indian people. In those days most Lumbee families worked small farms, and very many people were quite hard pressed. Before coming to the county I worked as a consultant to the US Office of Economic Opportunity, designing poverty and community action programs for six Native American reservations.

I used this experience to work with my companions Bruce Jones, Rod Locklear, and Horace Locklear, to put RDA together, before it became LRDA. I have come back to the county once or twice a year since, to work with Julian Pierce on the recognition petition in the 1980s, to visit friends, and to continue researching Lumbee and Tuscarora history (see my book, Living Indian Histories, U N C. Press, 2003).

I have spent most of my professional life trying to understand the situation of native peoples in helpful ways. My current research is in northeastern sub-Arctic Canada, where both Inuit (formerly called Eskimo) and Indian peoples have extremely high rates of youth suicide, child and adult substance abuse, and domestic violence, and are treated with ignorance and unconcern by the Canadian government – familiar treatment for native peoples, unfortunately. Before this work I studied famine in Africa, and why, in every famine throughout the 20th century, increasingly more women than men died.

Three experience in my life have shaped me: my families, my teaching, and my emotional and moral roots in Robeson County. My families kept me centered. I have been privileged to be a professor for 35 years in the City University of New York, with a joint appointment in the Undergraduate and Doctoral Faculties. I have been equally privileged to have made friends and alliances with wonderful people in Robeson County: I mention first the departed, for whom I still grieve: Mr Jim Chavis, Julian Pierce, Thadis Oxendine, Derek Lowery, Dexter Brooks, Tommie Dial, Adolph Dial, the Rev. Joy Johnson. And the people who remain so special in my life that, more than my degrees and accomplishments, they have shaped who I am: Barto and Geraldine Clark, who give meaning to the Native American reverence for Elders, Ruth Bullard Locklear, John Albert Locklear and family, Bruce Jones, Rod Locklear, Horace Locklear, John Jr. Locklear and family, Woodrow Dial, Emma Locklear, to name just a few.

I hope I do not embarrass by naming them, but my friends and companions and family are my biography.

CHERYL LOCKLEAR

Dr. Cheryl Ransom Locklear, a Fairmont native, is the owner of Ransom-Locklear Dental Services in Red Springs. A practicing dentist for over 20 years, Dr. Locklear also worked as a public health dentist for Robeson / Bladen County Schools.

The daughter of Marvin and Flora Ransom, Dr. Locklear became the first Miss Lumbee in 1967 and the first Native American to serve as a governor's page. She graduated valedictorian of her Pembroke High School class in 1971. An enthusiast of architecture and historic buildings, Dr. Locklear holds a North Carolina real estate broker's license.

Dr. Locklear earned her undergraduate degree at The University of North Carolina at Pembroke in 1975 and graduated Summa Cum Laude. Dr. Locklear was also named Distinguished Alumna of UNC Pembroke in 1993. She also holds a Master's of Public Health Administration from the University of

North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and was the first Native American to graduate from the University of North Carolina's School of Dentistry. In November of 1994, Dr. Locklear was one of 25 women presented with an Eagle Feather as a result of her inclusion in "Pathmakers: North Carolina Native American Women of Distriction." Dr. Locklear is a member of Alpha Pi Omega sorority and was awarded the 2008 Medicine Wheel Award by American Indian Mother's Inc.

Dr. Locklear is a member of the Board of Governors for the 17-member University of North Carolina, and is a member of the North Carolina Dental Society and the American Dental Association. She served on the Board of Visitors for the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and on the Board of Trustees for The University of North Carolina at Pembroke, serving as Board Chair for one year. She is an active member of Berea Baptist Church of Pembroke and she also sings in the choir.
