
Joseph Bell, MD (Lumbee) is the son of Sarah Sampson Bell and the late James (Buddy) Bell and grandson of the late Furman and Maggie Bell and the late Stanley and Eunice Sampson. Dr. Bell is the brother of Judge James Gregory Bell and Dr. Ronny A. Bell.

He has been married to Vicki Bell for the past 34 years. They have two children, Tori Alvarado (husband David) and Isaac Bell (wife Peyton) and two grandchildren, Elena and Luca.

He grew up in Pembroke and graduated from Pembroke Senior High School in 1977. He then went to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and became the first Lumbee to play on the UNC Junior Varsity basketball team. As an undergraduate, he served as President of the Carolina Indian Circle. Dr. Bell graduated from the UNC School of Pharmacy and the UNC School of Medicine in 1986.

After finishing his Pediatric residency at Moses
Cone Hospital in Greensboro, he became the first
Lumbee Pediatrician and the first Native American
Pediatrician in North Carolina. He worked at Carl
Albert Indian Hospital and Choctaw Nation Indian
Hospital in Oklahoma for four years. He returned
to Robeson County and worked for Robeson
Health Care Corporation as a Pediatrician and
Medical Director.

Dr. Bell has worked as a contract Pediatrician on the Catawba Indian Reservation for 24 years. He helped open Pembroke Pediatrics, a clinic of Children's Health of Carolina, in 1998. He served as medical director for 23 years. Presently, he works as a staff Pediatrician at Children's Health Pembroke (formerly Pembroke Pediatrics) and managing partner for Children's Health of Carolina.



Dr. Bell has served on the North Carolina Pediatric Society's Board. He is a member and past President of the Association of American Indian Physicians (AAIP), founding board member of the North Carolina American Indian Health Board and the AAIP Liaison to the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Committee on Native American Child Health (CONACH).

His awards include the AAIP Indian Physician of the Year Award, the AAP Native American Child Advocacy Award, the Physician Assistant Educational Association's Teacher of the Year Award and the North Carolina Pediatric Society's Dave Tayloe Sr. Award.

Dr. Bell is extremely honored to be serving as Grand Marshall of the Lumbee Homecoming parade this year.



Ashtyn, my personal MUA. Thank you for always glamming me up! I cherish you and our friendship so much! I love you forever!



Led by Executive Director Ron Ross, the circa 2021 organization serves Robeson County youth ages 6 to 18 with year-round educational and recreational programming after school and during the summer.

While September 16 promises to be a great day of support for The Center, Ross, his team of volunteers and one full-time staff member spend all year supporting the kids in their care. The BGC provides a safe place for students to learn, grow, and develop ongoing relationships with caring adults. Its life-enhancing programs focus on character development, sportsmanship, health, academic success, career exploration, mentoring, drug prevention and more.

Ross elaborated on one of his favorite programs with a sportsmanship focus.

"What we do with sportsmanship with our baseball-great Cal Ripken program is very important. If you have two kids that can come to our organization that can get along, chances are they can get along at school, too. Chances are they will get along outside of school. Maybe one day, they'll be working together or become neighbors, and they'll get still along. I can tell you I could spend hours telling stories of young people whose lives were changed just because of simple programs."

Ross has similar tales of his Center's emphasis on academics and mentoring. After an hour of relaxation and recreation after school, students at the Center must spend 30 minutes completing homework, studying or getting homework help, if needed. Students aged 13 and up with good grades may also get the opportunity to help their younger peers.

"I've never had one of my youth fail their grade during

all my years in Lumberton," Ross said.

BGC is an independently operated program that receives limited assistance from the county and city, said Ross, a youth development professional of 53 years who spent most of his career working for The Boys and Girls Club, first in Fayetteville, next in Lumberton. Starting as a program assistant with the national organization at age 18, he worked up into leadership positions. Now directing the two-year-old BGC, Ross, age 73, continues to work passionately in his life's calling.

The Center has approximately 110 youth members, Ross shared, serving between 30 to 50 kids who attend each week. Parents register their youth with a simple membership form that is available at the facility, located at 1310 N. Seneca Street in Lumberton. As not all members show up to the Center every day, attendance varies. However, drop-in care is not available. The Lumberton facility's membership costs \$10 per school year and \$10 for summer enrollment. "That is our goal," he said, "but if a child cannot pay, we do not let that stop him or her from attending."

With about \$100,000 needed annually to run the facility and all programming, Ross depends on contributions and fundraising to make ends meet. "We receive \$5,000 annually from the City of Lumberton and another \$2,500 from Robeson County," he explained. "Another \$30 to \$35,000 comes from contributions from individuals ranging from a \$10 donation to \$1,000. And we do a Christmas card mailout that nets another \$4 to \$6,000. We try to bring in the rest with our September special event."

Just as "it takes a village to raise a child" — a phrase from an African proverb that means it takes many people to provide what children need to flourish — it takes the community's backing of The Boys and Girls Center of Lumberton for it to succeed in its mission. Donuts, anyone?

CELEBRATE JESUS

Lees-McRae has roots in Robeson

Lees-McRae College, located in Banner Elk was founded in 1900 by Edgar Tufts as part of an Appalachian ministry of service and education. Known as the "Campus in the Clouds" (the school is 4,000 feet above sea level), Lees-McRae emphasizes personal religious values and vocational guidance that contributes to each student's welfare and growth.

Tufts, a newly ordained minister in the Southern Presbyterian Church, came to Banner Elk in 1897 with the intention of founding a congregation in the remote mountains of western North Carolina. Upon his arrival he found no church, no school, and no doctor. When he died in 1923, Tuft's vision had led to the founding of a college, the 20-bed Grace Hospital, and an orphanage caring for 100 children. Tufts named his fledgling school the Elizabeth McRae Institute for Girls in honor of a dedicated teacher from Robeson County. In 1905 Tufts created a boy's department and amended the

name of the school to honor benefactor Mrs. S. P. Lees of Kentucky and New York. The school was chartered by the state in 1907 as Lees-McRae Institute and in 1931 became Lees-McRae College.

So, who was Elizabeth MacRae? She was born Elizabeth Ann Harllee on November 13, 1825, to Colonel David Stuart and Harriet Brown Harllee in Marion County, SC. He was Sheriff of the county and later moved to Cheraw, SC where is became a leading merchant of the town. At the age of fifty-one he was admitted to the South Carolina Bar.

The June 22, 1842, issue Fayetteville Observer reported "Married in Cheraw, S.C., on the 9th, Dr. Neil McNair of Harlleesville, Marion District, to Miss Elizabeth Harllee, eldest daughter of Col. David S. Harllee of Cheraw". Soon after their marriage they moved to Alma, near Maxton, in Robeson County. She became

the mistress of the Argyle Planation, the McNair home. They attended Centre Presbyterian Church in Maxton.

The April 30, 1863, issue of the Fayetteville Semi Weekly Observer reported that Dr. Neill McNair died suddenly near his residence on April 9, 1863, at the age of 49. "He was full of health and vigor up to the moment of his departure. Either by a sudden of stroke of paralysis or by some affection of the heart, he fell and instantly passed away. Regular in his habits and temperate in all things, no man had fairer prospects of a long life and a green and happy old age. But "God's thoughts are not our thoughts" Dr. McNair will be missed but the entire community and especially by the poor, those, who need a friend to help them. He was a kind and affectionate husband and father, a faithful and steadfast friend, a generous and cheerful helper of those who needed help and a liberal supporter of the church and of every good cause".

Just a year later she lost her only child, David Harllee McNair. The family Bible says that he was serving in the Company D First Battalion of the Confederate States Army. He died of brain fever in the hospital at Fort Cashwell on July 28, 1864, at 17 years old. She wrote "he was my earthly all of pride and joy in the

world but "the Lord gave and the Loth hath taken away and blessed be His Holy name" My darling child is not dead but living, his glorified spirit is now summering in the realms of everlasting day safely housed safely home".

The next year marked three years of trouble and sadness when her Argyle Planation was raided. There are two accounts of the raid, one from a Fayetteville newspaper and the other appears in the book The Lowrie History, As Acted in Part by Henry Berry Lowry written by Mary Calhoun Bridgers Norment the widow of Owen C. Norment.

The Fayetteville Telegraph newspaper on March 6, 1865, reported:

"On Tuesday morning, about 1 o'clock, a band of deserters and escaped Yankee prisoners, 15 in number, and led by a Yankee naval officer, attacked the house of Mrs. Dr. McNair, in Robeson County, and, after spending nearly an hour in the attempt, forced an entrance by breaking down the front door. Mr. Wm. Stanton, of this County, was staying at Mrs. McNair's on the night in question, and being called by that lady to her assistance, soon after the attack commenced, promptly "reported for duty." An excited contest fol-


lowed, Mrs. McNair and Mr. Stanton both being provided with Colt's repeaters and a rifle, which they used with fatal effect; one of the attacking party being killed and another wounded in the breast. We regret to learn that Mrs. McNair was badly burned, and her face otherwise injured by fragments of glass and powder. Mr. Stanton was also slightly wounded.

Mrs. McNair and Mr. Stanton having exhausted their ammunition, the latter, at the urgent solicitation of Mrs. McNair (who feared the desperadoes would wreak vengeance on him for the death of their comrade,) retired, and she remained alone to brave their fury. On approaching her, the Yankee officer in command was so struck with her bold and determined mien, that, instead of harming her, he complimented her warmly on her conduct, stating that she was the first woman, who had offered any resistance to his band.

They carried off nearly all the valuables they could find, including silverware and jewelry, six thousand dollars in Confederate notes, and two breastpins, containing the pictures of Mrs. McNair's husband and son. The courage and determination of this noble woman savors more of romance than reality, but the incidents given in this article are literally true. It carried one back to the days of the Revolution, when the fearless women of the Colonies performed so many feats of wonder worthy to be imitated by many of the male sex whose knees are smiting together, like Belshazzar's, lest they be attacked by deserters and other roving desperadoes."

Mary Norment wrote in The Lowrie History "March I. 1865 the Lowry Gang raided Argyle. At the time of the raid, two families of kinsmen were residing at Argyle. Two Confederate "gentlemen friends" were also guests that particular night. A gun battle ensued between the intruders and the occupants of Argyle. Nevertheless, the Lowry Gang managed to enter the large plantation. When they neared the widow's personal bedroom, however, the Gang met firm resistance in the form of gunfire coming from within the bedroom. The gunfire probably was from a lieutenant from Fayetteville whom the widow knew intimately. The other one of her "gentlemen friends" hid in the closet throughout the shooting spree.

Capt. Owen T. Wright, ranking officer among the three escaped Yankee soldiers, was wounded during the exchange of gunfire. The widow and company were finally subdued. The Widow McNair boasted of being the one who fired the shots that felled Capt. Wright. William Lowry, then leader of the Lowry Gang, slapped the

proud and boastful widow. An escaped Yankee interceded on the widow's behalf, preventing William from doing her further bodily harm.

The Lowry Gang took the widow's wagons and teams and a number of slaves to drive for them. They then proceeded to load the wounded Wright in one and the plunder taken from the vast plantation in the others. Capt. Wright was deposited for safe keeping several miles from Argyle with the widow Amanda Nash, a schoolteacher known to possess Indian sympathy. The horses and wagons were returned to Argyle the next day at dawn."

Shortly afterwards she married Captain Alexander MacRae of Wilmington. He moved to her Argyle Planation. He died in 1881 and was buried in Wilmington's Oakdale Cemetery beside his first wife.

William S. Powell recounts her later years in his Dictionary of North Carolina Biography "Already reputed as capable of training the young, Mrs. MacRae had been responsible for teaching many of her young relatives and neighbors. After the death of her second husband, her teaching and missionary work spread throughout the region. A Presbyterian, she began a campaign to organize missionary societies for the women of the Fayetteville Presbytery. Her own minister, Dr. D. H. Hill, encouraged her in her work, but this was not true of a majority of his fellow ministers. Mrs. MacRae faced

opposition from the men and a lack of interest among the women. She refused to be deterred, however. At her own expense she visited all the churches of the presbytery scattered over eight large, sparsely populated counties. Since railroads were not always available, she traveled most often by horse and buggy. If no one came to a meeting, she scheduled another one for a later time. Gradually she wore down resistance, and the Missionary Union grew. When she was seventy, she traveled eight hundred miles to visit fifty-three communities, and by the end of 1896 she had traveled a total of nearly six thousand miles, generally in an open buggy regardless of the weather.


Meanwhile, Mrs. MacRae continued her teaching. Most of the year she taught in her home community, but she spent her summers teaching in the mountains. Once the success of her missionary societies was assured, she went out in search of a new career. In Banner Elk she established a school for poor mountain girls in a building that cost twenty-five dollars. She had no salary and no source of income. She had to battle suspicion as well as ignorance. She had no equipment or supplies, but she had faith. Mrs. MacRae taught academic subjects during the week and the Bible on Sunday. Her work attracted the attention of Mrs. S. P. Lees, who gave generously in support of the school. From it was established the present-day Lees-McRae College.

During a five-year terminal illness Mrs. MacRae lived with her stepdaughter, Mrs. J. F. Payne of Wilmington. She passed away at the age of eighty-three and was buried at Centre Church Cemetery, Maxton beside her husband and son.

No Fawns for Harnett and Robeson Counties This Year!



Wildlife rehabilitation is a little different this year for several counties across North Carolina. The North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission (NCWRC) has instructed eighteen counties, including Harnett and Robeson, not to take in fawns this year. The decision was made following a confirmed case of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) in a deer in Cumberland County within the last year. Per the NCWRC, "CWD is caused by abnormal prion proteins, which are extremely difficult to destroy and can remain infectious for decades after an area has been contaminated with them." It can pass from one deer to another by direct contact or even environmental contamination such as through contaminated water or soil. It is easily spread through saliva, urine, feces of live deer, blood, carcasses, and body parts. It is possible for fawns to become infected before they are born if the mother is infected. Once a deer has been infected with the disease it can take over a year before the deer shows visible signs of illness and is fatal as there is currently no cure for the disease. There are also no vaccines for the illness and no way to test for it while the deer is alive. Per the Center for Disease Control (CDC), there are currently no known cases of CWD being spread to humans.

Not only are licensed fawn rehabilitators in our area having to stop the intake of fawns, but also those wild-life rehabilitators that take in fawns and help get them to a licensed fawn rehabilitator. Deer will not be allowed to be transported across the county lines of those areas considered to be under surveillance. This includes deer that have been hunted. Only boned out

meat, cleaned skull caps, and finished taxidermy can be moved outside of the surveillance areas. The NCWRC has designated primary surveillance counties as Cumberland, Stokes, Surry, Wilkes, and Yadkin while secondary surveillance counties are Alexander, Alleghany, Ashe, Bladen, Davie, Forsyth, Guilford, Harnett, Hoke, Iredell, Robeson, Rockingham, and Sampson. A Wild Life encourages deer hunters to look out for updates to NCWRC rules and regulations regarding deer hunting for upcoming seasons.


A Wild Life would like to stress to the public that these rules not only apply to wildlife rehabilitators, but to the public as well. Therefore, if you find a fawn in any of these counties listed that you feel needs assistance, you should call the NCWRC wildlife helpline at 866-318-2401 (Monday-Friday 8:00 am – 5:00 pm). Wildlife biologists can be reached at this number and are ready to assist the public. Wildlife officers can be found by visiting www.ncwildlife.org and searching for Law Enforcement. Folks are always welcome to call A Wild Life. We can also help you find the wildlife officer for your area. Do not try to raise the fawn yourself as it is illegal and increases the risk of spreading the disease.

During this time, we would especially like to remind everyone that if you find a baby deer alone it does not necessarily mean it needs help. It is normal deer behavior for mother deer to leave their babies while they go to forage. The mother will return to the babies to nurse them and relocate them to another area. It can be up to twelve hours that a fawn is left alone. Please do not hesitate to call the NCWRC or A Wild Life if you have any questions about a fawn that you have found.

A Wild Life will continue to take in other wild animals that are sick, injured, or orphaned so please continue to contact us with any wildlife questions or concerns.

You have all heard the saying, hindsight is 20/20. Case in point, here is another example of introducing a plant and decades later, realize it was a disastrous decision. The Bradford pear was introduced to help fight fire blight in our common pear trees. The Bradford pear is a clone that has been grafted onto callery pear rootstock. It quickly gained popularity as a landscape tree, offering extra-early bloom in the spring - emerald green foliage and brilliant scarlet red fall color. It is a fast grower, gaining up to 2-feet a year, and highly adaptable. Of course there are always some drawbacks, which surfaced fairly soon.

The beautiful blooms STINK! Not only do they stink, but are often compared to the smell of rotting fish. Fast growth usually means weak wood, and Bradfords are notorious for narrow angles where the limbs attach to the trunk. This translates into trees that will break very easy in the smallest storm, or even under its own weight. So now the problem compounds into even worse news.

The Bradford did produce seeds that were small and sterile, another plus. Unfortunately, if a sprout grows from the callery pear rootstock, or if another pear tree is in the general vicinity and blooms, then the Bradford blooms can be pollinated and become viable seed.

The seed is distributed by birds and small mammals dining on the now-fertile fruits of the tree. These seed germinate easily and give rise to callery pear. Callery pear blooms extra early like the Bradford, still stinks, grows rapidly, produces fertile seed, and leafs out earlier than our native flora. The callery can quickly be identified by the 2 - to 4-inch thorns present on the branches. These thorns have been reported to be able to puncture a tractor tire. This tree can quickly produce thickets, invading pastures, open woodlands, grasslands, hedgerows, and ditch banks.

Current research by several universities, including NC State University, is showing these callery pears are cre-

ating ecological deserts and displacing our native flora. A short ride through the countryside or local town during bloom reveals the extent of this invasion. By leafing out earlier than our natives, it is shading them out and becoming the dominant species. There are over 500 species of caterpillars that feed on our oak and maple trees, but absolutely none feed on callery pear. Most wild birds, if not all, raise their young on caterpillars; no caterpillars equals no birds. We are now seeing serious disruptions in our natural ecology.

So what can we do? I am sure some may not like this answer, but we must remove the culprit from our landscape. Several states like South Carolina and Pennsylvania have banned the sale of Bradfords; some are offering a bounty for them, willing to give you a native tree in exchange for pictures showing the removal of a Bradford from your yard. Once we become aware of the problem, I hope we can appreciate the seriousness of this and voluntarily remove these menacing trees. There are some chemical herbicides we can treat the trees and stumps with to kill the vigorous root system that resprouts easily. Triclopyr and glyphosate are two that, when applied to a freshly cut stump, will stop


burns only 606.


BOMBS BURSTING IN AIIR By Mayor Charles Kemp







What's inside counts: A FEED FOR

Sooner or later, most home gardeners think about growing roses. Roses are available in almost any color imaginable and are suited to a number of sites. They can be mass planted in beds, used as specimen or trained plants, planted as screens or hedges, or located near fences or arbors and allowed to climb. Several miniature cultivars can even be used as a ground cover or as edging material. The most common classifications of modern roses today are hybrid tea, floribunda, grandiflora, climber, miniature, and shrub roses. These descended, in part, from eight species of roses which came to Europe from Asia in the 16th century. They became the

modern hybrids, principally because they were able to bloom repeatedly throughout the growing season. Most of the other species only bloom once, in June or July.

Roses should be planted where they receive 6-8 hours of full sunlight each day. The ideal site is one which offers full sun early in the morning, and late-afternoon shade. This will allow foliage and buds to dry early in the day, which will discourage diseases. Shade in the afternoon will encourage the development of good flower color. The area should be open, allowing for good air circulation.

Just about any soil will require either physical or chemical amendments before planting. Roses require good drainage. To provide this characteristic, it might be necessary to prepare a 'raised bed.' Since roses are expected to last several years, one should take extra time and effort in bed preparation. The soil should be tilled to a depth of 8-16 inches with lime added to adjust the pH up to the 5.5 or 6 range. Organic matter such as decayed sawdust, pine bark, compost, or manure may be added to soils to improve the tilth.

For best results planting should be done in the early spring or in the fall. If individual roses are to be planted, the hole should be large enough so roots can be spread out in the hole. A good plant will require a hole 12 inches deep and 18 inches wide. Broken roots should be pruned and the top portion cut back to 5-7 inches. Before putting soil back around the roots, be sure roots are loose and not pot bound. The backfill should contain native soil and not just prepared media. Roots will then grow out into the native soil and provide a better moisture relationship. Plants should be mounded slightly higher than "grade level." The soil should be tamped down to eliminate any air pockets. Watering during planting will also aid in this step.

As in any landscape planting, mulch will provide aid during stressful periods. Holding moisture, discouraging weeds, and preventing soil crusting are a few added benefits of a 3- to 4-inch layer of organic matter. Disease problems can be decreased if the mulch is replaced each spring.

A tendency for many new rose growers is to over-fertilize newly planted roses. Generally speaking, a commercial grade 10-10-10 or 8-8-8 fertilizer at the rate of 2-3 pounds per 100 square feet is adequate. This can be applied in two applications early in the growing season. The addition of cow manure as a supplement is also advised. When the buds begin to form, apply another application of 10-10-10 or equivalent at the rate of 1-2 lbs/100 square feet. Repeat this application every four weeks until mid-August.

When rose plants don't get a weekly soaking by natural rainfall, supplemental irrigation will be necessary. An excellent system would be the soaker hose. This provides moisture to the root system while keeping foliage dry. If an overhead system is used, a morning irrigation would be recommended as the foliage would have time to dry and lessen the possibilities of black spot or pow-

dery mildew infections.

Pruning could be one of the most important and necessary steps in growing roses. Correct pruning will improve the overall shape; promote new, healthier growth; and eliminate dead, broken, or diseased canes. Most of the pruning should be done in the spring, just as the buds break dormancy. The most important thing is to look at the buds. The gardener who prunes too early will gamble future growth to frost, and one who prunes too late will have a plant weakened by loss of sap. So watch for the buds: when they begin to swell, go ahead and prune. The height of the plant can be controlled by pruning. Pruning cuts should be clean and at a slant. The wood should be removed about 1/4 inch above an outside bud. Periodically dip the pruning shears in a 70 percent alcohol solution to decrease spread of disease organisms. Pruning diseased canes should be done as soon as necessary.


JOSEPH BELL

Carolina.




Dr. Bell has served on the North Carolina
