The Board of Directors of Lumbee Regional Development Association, Inc. have selected Noah and Ruth Woods as Grand Marshals for 2017, both of whom have dedicated their professional careers to service to others and provided professional and exemplary leadership to education, community service, politics and government.

Noah Woods has shaped his life through civic and community engagement for more than 30 years. Public service has been a driving force that began with involvement in public schools, volunteering with youth in coaching Babe Ruth baseball, and active involvement in community development. He supported the location of a public library in Pembroke as part of his service in and membership in the Pembroke Jaycees where he garnered election to office as Treasurer, Vice President, Jaycee of the Year, and Booster of the Year, while also serving as Vice President of the Robeson County Young Democrats Club, and a member of the State Executive Committee.

Community service includes membership and leadership. He served as Vice President of the Young Democrats of the Robeson County Democratic Party, and as an area appointee to the advisory council of the Regional Development Association. His commitment to service expanded opportunities for him to serve 27 years as a teacher and a school principal in the public schools of Robeson County, serving at Oxendine Elementary School. Mr. Woods earned a BS Degree in Elementary

Education from Pembroke State University where he is a member of the Alumni Association, a University where he was the recipient of the James W. Batten Distinguished Educator Award from the School of Education, participated in three summer National Science Foundation Institutes, and served as a Fellow in the US Department of Education.

During his career in education he maintained membership in Local, State and National professional affiliations, including the National Association of Elementary School Principals where he served as Seventh Congressional District representative, and on the Committee of concerns of Blacks and other minorities of color. He held membership in Phi Delta Kappa and actively participated in the North Carolina Association of Educators. Mr. Woods has been awarded Principle of the Year Award by the District 10 Division of the North Carolina Association of Educators and Boss of the Year Award by the Robeson County Educational Office Personnel.

Noah Woods has tempered his professional education career with political acumen in County, State, and National Government leadership and service. Elected as Robeson County Commissioner in 1990, he is currently in the 27th year of service and served nine years as Chairman, Commissioner Woods has served on the Jail Health Committee as Chairman of the Robeson County Board of Health and the Department has been recognized for excellence in environmental health, outstanding county programs for maternity services, citizen care for immunization, jail health, indigent eye care, and intensive livestock operations rules, and individual and career achievement awards by the Eastern District of the North Carolina Public Health Department. The Robeson County Health Department is recognized as an outstanding Health Department by the North Carolina Board of Health and the North Carolina County


In 2016 Noah Woods, Robeson County Commissioner, received the Distinguished Service Award on behalf of the 100 counties in North Carolina for "dedicated service on the National, State, and Local levels as a Robeson County Commissioner" and he was inducted into the North Carolina of County Commissioner Hall of Fame.

Ruth Dial Woods is a native of Robeson County, North Carolina. She attended public schools in Robeson County before attaining a B.A. Degree in English and Spanish from Meredith College in Raleigh, North Carolina, a MA.Ed. in School Administration from Pembroke State University, an Ed.D. in Educational Administration at South Carolina State University and a Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Dr. Woods served the public schools in Robeson County for 27 years as a teacher, educational media specialist, director of federal programs, and assistant and associate superintendent. After serving as an adjunct professor in the fall of 1993, Dr. Woods joined the full time faculty at Fayetteville State University where she taught educational leadership in the Master of School Administration degree program, curriculum and leadership in the doctoral program in educational leadership, coordinated the North Carolina Principal Fellows Program and the Master of School Administration Degree Program and administered the School of Education's Title III Teacher Education Program. In 1977, she received the Teacher of the Year Award for the Department of Educational Leadership and Secondary Education and the School of Education's Teacher of the Year Award.

In August 1977, Dr. Woods retired from teaching, but served as a consultant to the University-School Partnership Project and administered PROJECT REAP (Recruitment of Minorities for Advancement in the Profession), a partnership program of the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation and Fayetteville State University. More recently, Dr. Woods served as a program consultant for the Lumbee Tribal Council of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina as a part-time Tribal Administrator with administrative responsibilities for oversight of \$9 million in housing and other tribal programs.

Dr. Woods has extensive experience in rural economic development and rural manpower development. She was engaged in US Department of Labor pilot and demonstration programs in the rural manpower development under the auspices of the North Carolina Fund and North Carolina Manpower Inc. She held several administrative positions in community action programs and rural manpower development. She was instrumental in the successful transfer of comprehensive rural manpower development programs to the North Carolina Manpower Program \$1 Million + annually into Robeson county for job training and



employment services prior to the spin off of JTPA employment programs to the North Carolina Employment Services. She has served on the advisory board of Region N Council of Governments and coordinated the infusion of The Pacific Institute's Investment in Excellence for the 90s, an employment skills training and preparation program for youth and unemployed and underemployed recommended by the National Alliance of Businesses in to JTPA programs administered by Region N council of Governments.


Dr. Woods is the recipient of numerous community, civic, state and national awards. She has balanced her academic life with service to others. Active in civil and human rights, Dr. Woods self-defines as American Indian, humanist, activist, and feminist. Selected honors and awards include the Leo Reano Award for Service to Education from the National Education Association; the North Carolina Human Relations Award from the North Carolina Association of Educators; the Henry Berry Lowry Award from Lumbee Regional Development Association; the governor's Distinguished Woman of North Carolina Award, and the Woman of Distinction Award from United Tribes of North Carolina.

Dr. Woods is the first woman to receive an at-large appointment by the North Carolina General Assembly to the University of North Carolina Board of Governors in 1985, and in March, 1999, was the only woman in the field of 10 candidates and the second highest votegetter in the at-large category to again receive an appointment to this distinguished Board.

Support is provided to NC Pre-K classrooms by providing technical assistance, consultation, and coaching on topics such as: behavior management, classroom structure, family engagement and other identified needs.

Financial assistance is provided to child care facilities to transport eligible NC Pre-K children to and from approved NC Pre-K sites. This activity ensures that children are able to attend a high quality learning environment to promote their overall development.

#### NURSE FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

Registered nurses visit eligible women in their homes during their first pregnancy and throughout the first two years of their children's lives. The program is a statewide initiative following a national model that seeks to improve pregnancy outcomes and child health through primary prevention. Additionally, the program seeks to improve the economic self-sufficiency of the family through personal development goals.

#### PROGRAM COORDINATION, COMMUNITY EDUCATION. AND EVALUATION

The Program Department encompasses a variety of methods aimed at increasing the capacity of early childhood initiatives and community awareness.

Some of these approaches include data collection, information management, monitoring, evaluation, technical assistance, and training to support effective implementation of programs and strategies. These programs also work to enhance community collaboration and promote services funded by the partnership within the community.

Professional Development provides services for licensed child care facilities in Robeson County. Services include professional development plans to assist child care providers and center plans to assist child care directors. The Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) and My Teaching Partner are also utilized. Professional Development Awards are offered to eligible

Additionally, Professional Development Services offers a Praxis prep course to provide additional support with Praxis Core test preparation. Individuals completing the prep course and successfully passing the Praxis are eligible for a monetary award.

### READY, SET, GO Agency: Riverbend Services, Inc. (910) 618-9260

Training and consultation is offered to child care providers on applying promotion, prevention, and intervention when working with children who experience developmental and/or behavioral health symptoms. The Pyramid Model and Cognitive Behavioral techniques are used to incorporate positive, problem-focused, and goal-directed interventions. Child care staff are trained on using specific techniques that promote a healthy environment for children to grow emotionally and developmentally.

# WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT



Lumbee Regional Development Association, Inc. (LRDA) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Program (WIOA) is funded by the Department of Labor. The purpose of the Indian and Native American Programs, under WIOA (Subtitle D, Section 166) is to support the employment and training activities for Indian, Alaska Native and Hawaiian individuals in order to develop more fully their academic, occupational and literacy skills; make them more competitive in the workforce, and to provide services in accordance with the goals and values of the service area communities.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

In Georgia, the counties are: Habersham, Towns, Union and Rabun.



## Lumbee Tribal Housing Down Payment Assistance Program



Do you have a family of four and make \$68,000 OR LESS PER YEAR?

YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR DOWN PAYMENT ASSISTANCE!

The Down Payment Assistance Program provides a one-time assistance to approved applicants in amounts up to \$12,000 for the purchase of decent, sanitary, and safe housing. The amount of assistance is based upon the applicant's household income and size.

Applications are accepted for down payment assistance from applicants who meet the eligibility requirements, which include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Applicant must be an enrolled member of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina.
- Applicant must have obtained pre-approval from a financial institution.
- Applicant must be at least 18 years of age.
- Applicant must be a first time homebuyer.

Applicants for down payment assistance must not have received prior housing assistance from the Lumbee Tribe or any other governmental housing agency for the construction or purchase of a home. Tribal members who receive down payment assistance must agree to use the home being purchased as their primary residence during the term of the agreement. The purchased home must be located within the tribal service area of Cumberland, Hoke, Robeson, and Scotland Counties.
