Grand Marshall Noah Woods



NOAH WOODS is a native son of Robeson County. Born to a family of 18 siblings, he was steeped in traditional American Indian values and work ethic and has honored his family and his community through outstanding leadership and service in education, church and community involvement, and civic and political affairs. His leadership has been recognized at local, state and national levels.

Woods holds degrees from Pembroke State University and East Carolina University and also studied at Mercer University and Earlham College as a National Science Foundation Fellow. Woods served as Alumni President for Pembroke State University and received the School of Education's James W. Batten Distinguished Educator Award from East Carolina University. Woods also served as an Office of Education Fellow in the Adults-Basic Education Division of the U.S. Office of Education. Woods was appointed by the State Superintendent for Public Instruction as a Time to Teach Facilitator for the Southeast Region. Woods was one of the first members of the Advisory Committee on Education for Lumbee Regional Development Association.

His educational career of 38 years included six years as a classroom teacher and thirty-two years as school principal at Oxendine Elementary, Magnolia High School, Pembroke Middle School and Pembroke Elementary School in Robeson County. He held professional memberships in the Tarheel Principal and Assistant Principal Association, the National Association of Elementary School Principals, the North Carolina Principals Association, and the National Association of Elementary School Principals. In 1982, he received a White House appointment by President Jimmy Carter to the National Advisory Council on Indian Education. Woods received the Principal of the Year Distinguished Service Award from District 10 of the North Carolina Association of Educators and the Boss of the Year Award from the Robeson County Educational Office Personnel.

Wood's leadership and service have equally impacted civic and community involvement. He extended his commitment to youth beyond the classroom as a Babe Ruth Baseball Coach and T-ball Coach and organizer for 30 years. He was one of the initial incorporators of Riverside Country Club of Pembroke and a member of the Board of Directors and Treasurer. He membership in the Pembroke Jaycees spanned more than 10 years during which time he served as Treasurer, Internal Vice-President, and President and received recognition as a recipient of the Key Man Award, Outstanding Spoke Award, Spark Plug Award, Outstanding Young Educator, Jaycee of the Year and Rooster of the Year. Woods has also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Robeson County Historical Drama Association.

Woods has been a member of the Robeson County Democratic Party since 1972. He served as vice president of the Robeson County Young Democrats Club and served two terms as a member of the State Executive Committee of the North Carolina Democratic Party. In 1990, Woods was elected and continues to serve as District IV Commissioner for the Robeson County Board of Commissioners. He has served as Chair of the Human Relations committee, the Zoning Board of Adjustments, and as a member of the Public Works committee, the Jail Health Committee, Chair of the Robeson County Board of Health and a member of the Robeson Community College Board of Trustees. Woods has been elected as Third State Vice-President, Second State Vice-President, and First State Vice-President and in 2003, he was elected State President of the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.

Woods gives honor to God through his service and leadership in First United Methodist Church where he serves as Superintendent. He gives honor to God for his family and his extended family that nurtured him, encouraged him, and supported him through many struggles as a young man. It was here, according to Woods, that he knew his life would be dedicated to helping others, serving mankind and helping to make a difference in the lives of others.

Woods takes great pride in carrying the torch of the Brewers, the Bullards, the Locklears and the Woods – Indian families from whom he is descended and in whose lineage he takes and walks with great pride and humility. "I care, because they cared; I care because someone cared for me. I serve because God has given me the opportunity and the privilege to do so."
