










Grand Marshall



MR. JAMES CLIFFORD DIAL is a retired educator and a lifelong service member of the military. He graduated in 1948 from Pembroke High School and continued his education after the military with the Serviceman's Readjustment Act, also known as the GI Bill. He earned his BS degree in Mathematics in 1954. He continued pursuing education and earned a Master's degree in Mathematics from the University of Georgia, a principal's certificate from the University of NC at Chapel Hill, and an Educational Specialist degree (Ed.S) in Educational Administration from East Carolina University.

Mr. James C. Dial grew up in the Beulah Baptist area of Robeson County. He was one of nine children born to Richard A. Dial and Lena Jacobs Dial. In August 1957 he married Quessie Cummings Dial and they are parents to three daughters, Rhonda, Brenda, and Vicky. He is

a member of the First United Methodist Church in Pembroke, and has attended the church since 1954, after his return from the war.

He was drafted into the military service in May 1951. Immediately, after Army training camp, he was assigned to serve in the United States Army 3rd Infantry Division in the Korean War. In 1952, Mr. Dial fell with severe injuries in a combat zone and was treated in an Army Field Hospital; he was then shipped to Tokyo Hospital. Later, he was evacuated to California and eventually, on to Walter Reed Hospital. His last hospital stay as a result of the injuries stationed him at Fort Bragg, NC. He received several medals for his military service including - Valor/Bravery, Korean Service Medal, 3 Battle Stars, Purple Heart, Good Conduct, and others. In 1976, the Ambassador of the Republic Korea to the United States of America presented Mr. Dial a special military award for services rendered on behalf of the President of South Korea. During the Vietnam War, Mr. Dial served as a consultant, counselor, and educator for the Special Forces Operations. He is a lifetime member of the Disabled American Veterans and Veterans of Foreign War.

Mr. Dial began his teaching career in mathematics at Pembroke High School in 1954. He taught high school math for ten years before entering into school administration. Through his professional career, Mr. Dial benefited from his pursuant of higher education through the Sputnik Response (1960s). His cumulative mathematical ability, administrative practicality and military experience supported his selection of participation in multiple Math and Science initiatives throughout the United States and in tribal communities. Mr. Dial served as a school principal at Deep Branch Elementary and then was assigned to Pembroke Graded School. Mr. Dial remained at Pembroke Elementary until his retirement in 1994. His total experience in education was more than 40 years. Mr. Dial considers the thirty years of service to the students and community as a school principal of Pembroke Graded/Elementary his greatest professional accomplishment. He is distinguished as one of the longest tenured principals in the Robeson County school system to remain at one school; this school being Pembroke Graded/Elementary. His greatest gift of acknowledgement from his professional career in education and the Pembroke community was the Pembroke Elementary media center being named the James C. Dial Media Center. He is a lifetime member of National Educators Association.

MR. JAMES F. "BUDDY" BELL is a retired educator who has provided outstanding leadership in the areas of education, civic, and community affairs in Robeson County and the Pembroke area. "Buddy" Bell served 30 years in the Public Schools of Robeson County in administrative positions at Fairgrove High, Deep Branch Elementary, Pembroke Junior High, Pembroke Middle, and Swett High School. He served for over 43 years as a leader with the events of the Lumbee Homecoming Festival and the Pembroke Veterans Day Parade. He served as a key leader with the "First and Ten Campaign" of UNC-Pembroke to establish and develop the successful football program at UNC-Pembroke.

In 2011, Mr. Bell received the Distinguished Service Award at the annual Homecoming of UNC-Pembroke. He is a 1958 graduate of UNC-Pembroke, (then Pembroke State College) and was an outstanding athlete. He served as Captain of the baseball and basketball teams and lettered in basketball and baseball for four years. He is one of the most recognizable alumni at UNC-Pembroke because of his extensive activities on campus and in the Pembroke community. Mr. Bell served as a member of the UNC-Pembroke Board of Trustees from 1988-1991.

From 1951 to the present, Buddy Bell has served with distinction in the following agencies and organizations: Public Schools of Robeson County; Lumbee Regional Development Association; Town of Pembroke; UNC-Pembroke; Pembroke and Robeson County Recreation Departments; North Carolina Commission of Indian Affairs; United States Army; Four County Community Services; and Robeson County Partnership for Children.

In his work with the public schools, Buddy Bell said he mostly enjoyed his work in helping to guide and assist students to encourage them to finish high school and attend college. He served as a leader in sports programs in some of the schools. He served as coach for the basketball and baseball teams at Fairgrove High School. He worked to help build and support the Rams Booster club at Purnell Swett High School. Mr. Bell said he is proud to see the student athletes from local schools who attend college and perform well at major universities.


Mr. Bell served and provided long term leadership to the Town of Pembroke in organizing and supervising major parades held during the annual Lumbee Homecoming Festival and Veterans Day celebrations. The Homecoming and Veterans Day parades are very large events involving over 100 units and are enjoyed by over 10,000 people each year. The Veterans Day parade involves ROTC units from schools throughout the county and recognizes distinguished veterans in the region.

Mr. Bell has served as an outstanding leader in community and civic affairs in the Pembroke area since 1958. Among his many community activities, he is a lifetime member of the Pembroke Veterans of Foreign Wars. He has served as a member of the Pembroke Kiwanis, UNC-Pembroke Braves Club, Pembroke Lions Club, and Pembroke Jaycees. He served for 10 years as a coach for Little League Baseball and Basketball in the Pembroke and Robeson County Recreation Departments.


Buddy Bell has a distinguished military service record, with two years active duty and six years in the Army Reserves. From 1951 to1953, he served in the U.S. Army in the First Calvary Division. In 1951, he saw action in battle in the Inchon Landing in the Korean War. He received two Bronze Stars for his military service. He dropped out of high school to enlist in the military and returned home to complete high school and college.

Mr. Bell was born in 1931 in the Saddletree Community of Robeson County. He graduated from Magnolia High in 1954. Mr. Bell and his wife Sarah Sampson Bell live in Pembroke. They have three children, Judge James G. "Greg" Bell, Dr. Joseph T. Bell, and Dr. Ronny A. Bell, and seven grandchildren. They have three grandchildren who finished college in 2012.





In Memoriam – Mr. Willie French Lowery



MR. WILLIE FRENCH LOWERY was one of the most well known musicians of the Lumbee Tribe. He worked for over forty years as a professional singer, songwriter and guitarist. He performed with nationally known artists such as Floyd Westerman, Ulali, The Allman Brothers, and Clyde McPhatter, and has recorded with several nationally known musical groups.

A towering figure in the Lumbee culture, Willie Lowery died peacefully on May 3, 2012 at Southeastern Regional Medical Center, after a 12-year battle with Parkinson's disease. Lowery gave most of his creative energies to musical efforts in support of the Lumbee Tribe, serving as a mentor to many people. His 1979 album "Proud to be a Lumbee", struck a special chord with youths and cultural leaders.

Willie Lowery had major success with the song "Streets of Gold" which reached #1 in East coast markets. He published over 500 songs which have been recorded by numerous gospel, rock, country and R&B artists. He composed the original songs for "Strike At the Wind!", an

outdoor drama that tells the story of Lumbee hero Henry Berry Lowery. Willie Lowery's solo albums include "Proud to be a Lumbee," "A Tribute to Old Main," and "Thunder Beings of Light," all of which he recorded as educational tributes to his history and culture.

In efforts to motivate youths, Mr. Lowery performed in public schools in Robeson County and throughout North Carolina. He was named "Tarheel of the Week" for his work with Indian youth and his contributions to North Carolina history. For nine years he produced and recorded dozens of artists at Soundsation Recording Studio in Lumberton, NC.

In the Lumbee community, Lowery was best known for his work in producing music for the outdoor drama "Strike at the Wind!" and his work to assist Lumbee youths to develop musical skills. In 1976, Lowery composed the musical score for "Strike at the Wind!" which was performed in Pembroke for over two decades. The drama portrays the life of Henry Berry Lowerie, who Willie called "the king of kings, the Indian Robin Hood," for his battle for justice in Robeson County in the period after the Civil War.

As a young man, Lowery toured with Clyde Mcphatter and shared stages with artists as diverse as Paul McCartney, Linda Ronstadt, the Allman Brothers, Canned Heat, and Tower of Power. In later years, Lowery performed at Stanford University, Harvard University, and the University of Tokyo.

Born in 1944, Willie was the son of Margie Revels Lowery and Lorenzo "Buddy" Lowery and worked on cotton and tobacco farms as a youth. As a youth, Willie said he could "always hear music in my head as I was plowing with the old mule." Lowery began his musical career at an early age and was earning a living as a musician by age 16. In 1970, his song "Streets of Gold" reached #1 on the pop charts in the Carolinas, Virginia, Philadelphia, and New York.

"Activist is the most beautiful word in the English language," Willie liked to say. He gave unselfishly of his time and talent for community causes and to encourage musical talent among young people. He was always rooted in his place. "North Carolina was my refuge, my place of comfort," he said. "I'd come back to find my direction and get back into the idea that, "Willie, you ain't no better, but you got to keep trying."

WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT





Lumbee Regional Development Association, Inc. Workforce Investment Act Program (WIA) is funded by the Department of Labor. The purpose of Subtitle D, Section 166 (Indian and Native American Programs), under WIA is to support the employment and training activities for Indian, Alaska Native and Hawaiian individuals in order to develop more fully the academic occupational and literacy skills of such individual; make such individuals more competitive in the workforce, and to provide services in accordance with the goals and values of the community.

On the Job Training

This program provides training in the private or public sector. It is given to a participant who has been hired first by the employer, and occurs while the participant is engaged in productive work that is providing knowledge or skills essential to the full and adequate performance of the job. The employer is reimbursed 50% of the participant's wages.

Work Experience

This program is a short-term or part-time work assignment in the public or private sector. It is designed to enhance the employability of individuals through the development of good work habits and basic work skills to obtain a good job.



Classroom Training

This program activity is any training of the type normally conducted in an institutional setting. It includes vocational education and is designed to provide individuals with the technical skills to obtain certification and/or information required to perform a specific job or group of jobs.
